D-DAY BEACON LIGHTING EVENT

On Thursday 6 June 2024, countries across the world will come together to mark 80 years since the D-Day landings and Battle of Normandy.



The D-Day landings on 6 June 1944 were the largest seaborne invasion in history. Along with the associated airborne operations, it marked the beginning of the liberation of France and western Europe.

To commemorate this huge event in world history, beacon lightings are taking place across the United Kingdom and its overseas territories.

Events begin at 8.00am on 6 June with the D-Day 80 Proclamation by Town Criers across the UK, the Channel Islands and six other nations.

From 6.00pm, the Town Council is honoured to be holding a commemorative event to accompany the beacon lighting at Victoria Pleasure

There will be entertainment in the form of dance, music, and games, in addition to food and drink. This event, suitable for all the family, will precede the beacon lighting and reading of The International Tribute, which both take place at 9.15pm.

NEW WEALDEN DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Ground

In early April, a by-election was held to elect a new Wealden District Councillor for the Uckfield New Town Ward

A closely-fought contest was confirmed by a recount completed after midnight. Donna French - who is also a Town Councillor and will shortly step down as Deputy Town Mayor - won by a margin of four votes from her opponents Keith Wilson (Labour - 578 votes), and Helen Firth (Conservative - 413 votes). Cllr. French said: "On 4 April, the residents of Uckfield's New Town Ward put their faith in me, and I was elected as their new District Councillor. "As with my Town Council role, I stand as an Independent. I intend to work with the other Independent Councillors and also cross-party for the benefit of the Ward. Town and District.



"I am looking forward to my new role, although I realise that there are plenty of challenges ahead. The most urgent is scrutinising the Draft Local Plan, which is possible until 10 May. Time is limited to have our say and feed back our points for consideration. It is a huge task to ensure that we have the best Plan possible, for Uckfield especially. "Please do not hesitate to contact me if you need to and I look forward to this new chapter."

COUNCILLOR UPDATE

Councillors can only hold the position of Chair for a maximum term of three years. This year, our Town Mayor, and two of our three Committee Chairs, reach the end of their three-year terms.

To celebrate the work they have achieved, we caught up with Councillors Jackie Love, Karen Bedwell and Spike Mayhew to find out what is next for them.



Cllr. Jackie Love - Town Mayor (2021-24)

It has been an absolute honour to have been Uckfield's Mayor for the last three years. Uckfield has been my family home for 25 years, and every single day the town warms my heart with its community spirit. I hope I have supported this amazing spirit and that you feel as a Town Council we have made a difference. I still have another three years ahead representing Uckfield as a Town Councillor, which will take me to a grand total of 12 years representing the town.



Cllr. Karen Bedwell - Chair of Plans Committee (2021-24)

After three years as Chair of the Plans Committee, I can reflect on the committee's crucial work in representing the views of residents. We have attended and spoken at two planning inquiries and a planning hearing, successfully challenged Bird In Eye and Downlands Farm plans, and supported residents in getting their voices heard at Mockbeggars Farm. Personally, it has meant long days, lots of reading and being out of my comfort zone, but I have enjoyed the challenge and am proud of what we have achieved.



Cllr. Spike Mayhew - Chair of Environment & Leisure Committee (2021-24) and former Town Mayor (2018-21)

It has been a very busy time over the last three years for the Environment and Leisure Committee. We have danced at Weald on the Field, the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the King's Coronation, welcomed our friends from Arques-la-Bataille, and supported fitness classes on Harlands Field. We have tackled ash dieback and started replanting our woodlands, supported our ground staff and formed working groups to engage with allotment holders and sports pitch users. I look forward this year to the D-Day celebrations, another Weald on the Field and the challenges of a new role within Uckfield Town Council.

IMPROVEMENTS TO TOWN CENTRE CCTV

Public-facing CCTV cameras operating across the county of East Sussex were upgraded in April after funding was secured.

The upgrade included the Town Centre CCTV system within Uckfield.

A third of the costs for funding the upgrade was secured by the Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner through the Home Office Safer Streets 5 programme, and it is estimated that the new system will save an average of half of annual maintenance costs.

Supporting new technology

The cameras, owned by local authority partners across Sussex, were upgraded to support digital functionality. With updated technology, the cameras would continue to be accessed by Sussex Police to support lawful purposes, and address crime and disorder.



CCTV coverage has continued to operate as usual while the upgrade work has been underway.



'Providing valuable support'

Assistant Chief Constable Howard Hodges said: "We are pleased that cameras across the county are being upgraded to new digital cameras with better functionality.

"These cameras, owned by individual town, district and county councils, play a crucial role in crime reduction efforts by providing valuable support to law enforcement.

We recognise the importance of CCTV, and residents and visitors can be assured that the cameras will continue to be a supportive tool for improving community safety here in Sussex."

Speaking in March 2024, Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne added: "This funding is particularly valuable during times of financial strain nationwide, enabling councils to sustain and advance this essential work."
